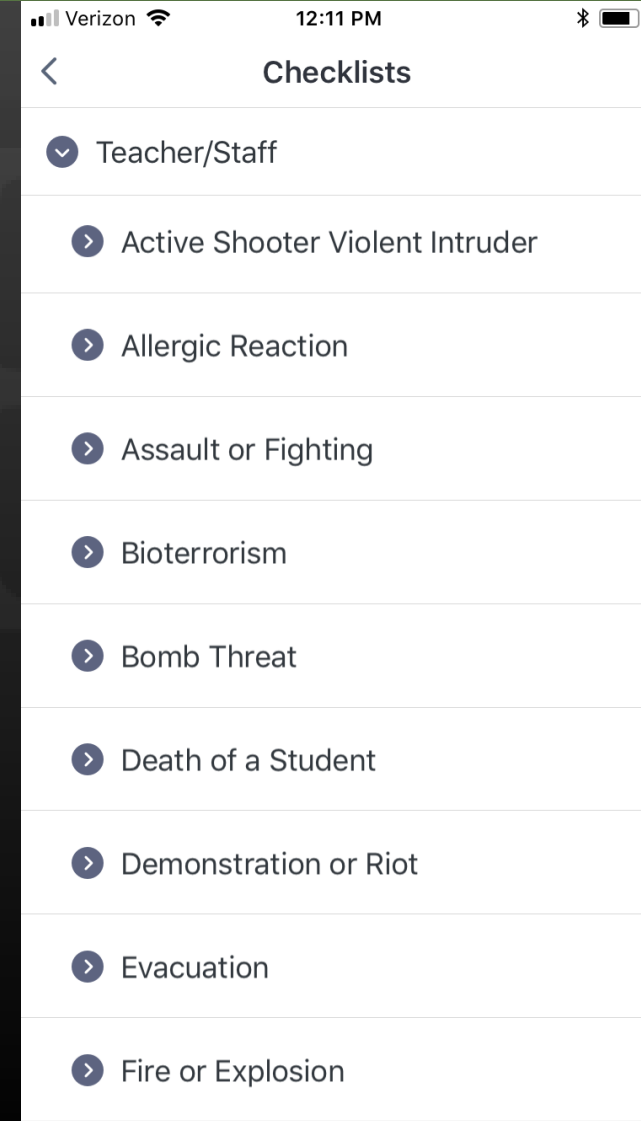
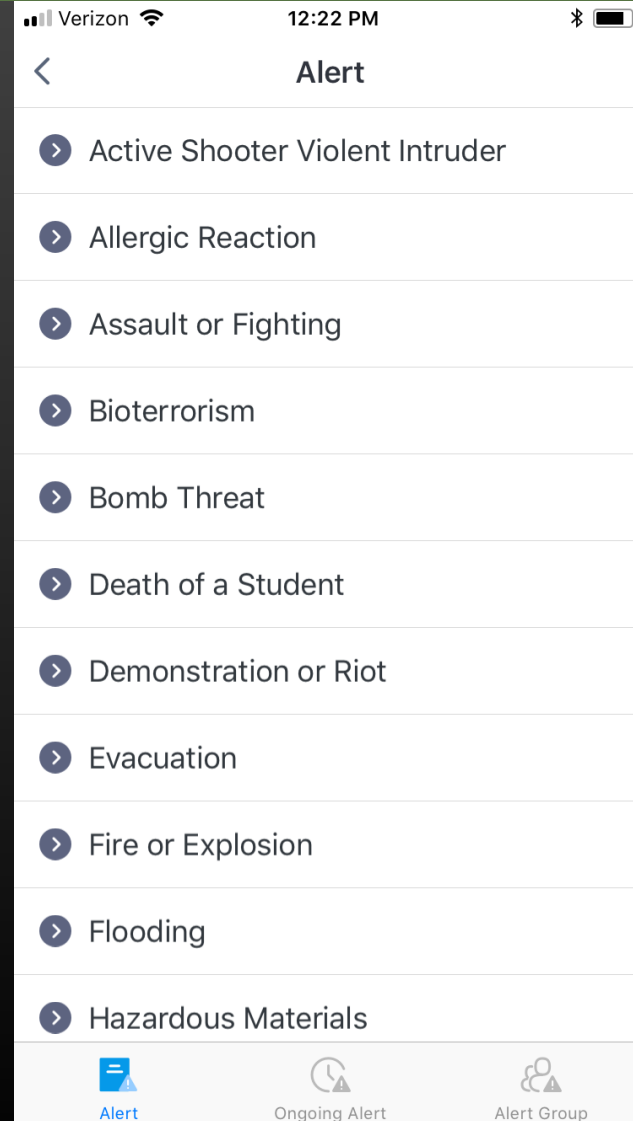
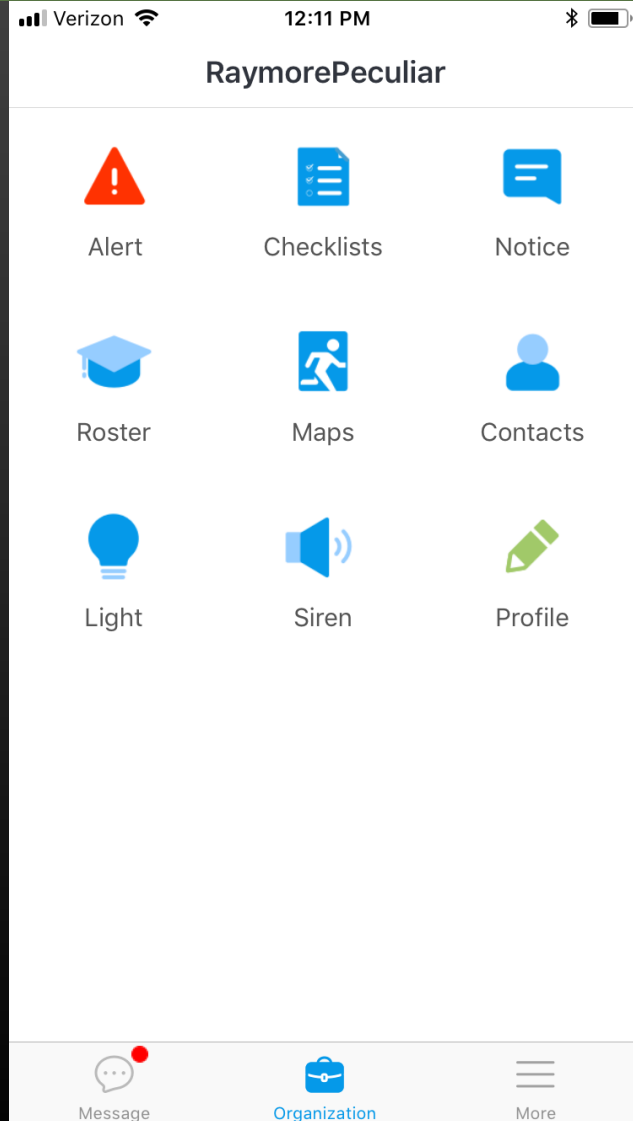

Goal #1: Increase anti-bullying efforts measured by perception of stakeholders (patrons and staff) from 3.55 to 4.0.

Goal #2: Increase student safety measured by perception of stakeholders (patrons and staff) from 3.92 to 4.20.

Goal #3: Increase effectiveness of communication of emergency information measured by perception of stakeholders (patrons and staff) from 4.07 to 4.20.
